"I found myself homeless and unemployed. After two months of living out of my car, I found my way to Hope's Path. Unfortunately, I ran into a string of disagreements with the program I chose to live out of my car again in hopes of finding peace. Not too long after I made this decision, I ran into car trouble. I reached out to Billy (Board Director) and Ted (Program Director) who helped me get my car working again. Ted allowed me to come back to Hope's Path encouraging me that things would be different. Indeed, things were much different and much better. When I lost my job several months later, Hope's Path offered me a temporary position until I could find employment that was a right fit for

me and my future. Now, I have moved to Estes Park, Colorado where I work and I get to enjoy both nature on top of the mountain and the city at the bottom of the mountain. Thank you to Hope's Path and all their supporters for making this possible."
